RE: Christopher James Clay v. The Queen S.C.C. No. 28189

I am writing in response to the letter of Mr. Frankel, dated July 15, 2003, concerning his submission of R. v. Murdock, [2003] O.J. No. 2470 (C.A.) to the Court for its consideration with respect to the above-noted appeal and the two related appeals.

I take no objection to the Court having regard to the *Murdock* decision so long as the Court is also provided with a copy of the B.C. Court of Appeal's recent decision in R. v. Schedel, [2003] B.C.J. No. 1430, ten copies of which are enclosed. The Respondent was provided with a draft of this letter, and has no objection to it, and the judgment in *Schedel*, being provided to the Court.

In Schedel, the B.C. Court of Appeal considered the application of the three s. 24(2) factors governing exclusion/admission of unconstitutionally obtained evidence of a marijuana grow operation. In a concurring opinion, Southin J.A. wrote: "While at one time I accepted the received wisdom that marihuana offences were serious crimes, I now am of a different opinion, having been persuaded to the contrary by, among other writings, the judgment of my colleague, Prowse J.A. in R. v. Malmo-Levine [citation omitted]." Southin J.A. also expressed doubts as to whether the regulation of marihuana use is a subject matter that is within the legislative competence of Parliament. In particular, I would draw the Court's

attention to paragraphs 83, 84 and 87 to 97 of her judgment.
